1. PURPOSE

The Washington International Mobile Photography Awards provides mobile photography enthusiasts with a platform to share and showcase their work, to capture and tell stories through their images, and to share personal reflections behind them.

4. THEME CATEGORIES

There are four theme categories: Everyday Life, Nature and Landscape, People and Documentary, and Art and Creativity.

4.1 Theme 1: Everyday Life

This category is for stories about the human touch of everyday life, capturing its beauty, warmth, diversity, and depth through images.

This theme captures the warmth and beautiful moments in everyday life — documenting the diverse facets of city streets, the poetry hidden in daily routines, and the tenderness in ordinary scenes. It seeks to reveal the extraordinary beauty in the ordinary, inspiring deeper reflections on the warmth and strength of human relationships.



4.1.1 Prohibited Content

Overly staged photography, commercial advertising, and images involving violence or vulgarity are not accepted.

4.1.2 Submission

- Single Photo: One photo per entry (subject matter may vary).
- Photo Series (accepted only in the Everyday Life Theme): A set of four–six images (up to three series per entrant).

4.2 Theme 2: Nature and Landscape

- Works featuring natural elements or landscapes as the main subject
- Natural elements can include animals, plants, or natural phenomena

4.3 Theme 3: People and Documentary

- Works showcasing cultural activities and human landscapes
- Portraits, urban architecture, and social events

4.4 Post-Processing Guidelines for Themes 1-3

- Dust spots and noise may be removed.
- No adding, replacing, or moving compositional elements.
- No alterations that change the original scene's structure.
- AI-generated images are not permitted

4.5 Theme 4: Art and Creativity

- Works expressing abstract or creative content through artistic methods and techniques.

4.6 Post-Processing Guidelines for Theme 4

- No restrictions on post-processing or image editing
- Imaginative or conceptual images and visual art through post-processing are allowed



- AI-generated images are NOT accepted

5. AWARDS

5.1 Theme 1: Everyday Life

There are two subcategories under this theme: Single Photo and Photo Series.

Each offers the following awards:

- First-Place (Gold) Award: One winner, \$300
- Second-Place (Silver) Award: Three winners, \$200 each
- Third-Place (Bronze) Award: Five winners, \$100 each
- Honorable Mention: Certificates of Recognition

5.2 Themes 2, 3, and 4

For Themes 2, 3, and 4 (Single Photo only, no Photo Series entries), the following awards are given:

- First-Place (Gold) Award: One winner, \$300
- Second-Place (Silver) Award: Two winners, \$200 each
- Third-Place (Bronze) Award: Three winners, \$100 each
- Honorable Mention: Certificates of Recognition



6. JUDGING PANEL

6.1 Specially Appointed Art Consultant: Yueheng Duan



Mr. Yueheng Duan is a two-time recipient of the American Benny Gold Award, earning the honor at the 62nd and 70th ceremonies. His accolades include the Sino-Canadian Cultural Outstanding Contribution Award from the Canadian government (2017), the Lifetime Achievement Award at the first Canadian IPF International Photography Festival (2015), and the Gold Award at the 5th China Printing Awards.

Mr. Duan's photographic works are held in the collections of numerous art institutions and private collectors. He has also served as a judge for international photography exhibitions, directed photography art festivals, and published three photography art albums: Black and White World, Black and White Vision, and Black and White Realm.



6.2 Chair of the Judging Panel: John Fan



Recipient of the CUSPEA (China-U.S. Physics Examination and Application) scholarship in his early years, Dr. John Fan has lived in the United States for over 30 years and has worked across diverse fields including physics, medicine, and photography.

He holds a Ph.D. in Physics, is a specialist in radiological medicine, and a Fellow of the American Association of Physicists in Medicine (AAPM). At the same time, he is also a curator and the China Ambassador for the world-renowned online photography art gallery 1x.com, as well as one of the founding members of the Four Apertures Photography Team.

His photographic work has won numerous awards in the international photography community, has been frequently published in both domestic and international media, exhibited in many international exhibitions, and collected by multiple image agencies.

Holds dual degrees in arts and sciences from Tsinghua University. He is Vice President of the Atlantic Photographers Association, former Vice Chairman and Art Mentor of the North American Mobile Photography Association, and a member of several photography associations across North America. He also serves as a photojournalist for *Maple Voice Canada*.

His work has won numerous awards in various photography competitions. He is a certified senior landscape photographer on the platform TuChong. He has frequently served as a judge and head judge for photography competitions.

In 2021, he was one of the lecturers at the television photography forum *"Poetry and the Distance, Connected by Heart and Hand."*



Enpu Yang

Retired Professor at Beijing Film Academy, Honorary Dean of Huaguang Photography College, and Advisor to the China Overseas Chinese Photography Association.

He graduated from Beijing Film Academy in 1961 and has devoted his career to film and television production, creating a large number of documentaries and educational films. Representative works include *The Maritime Silk Road* and *Photography Guide*.

Since the 1990s, he has also been involved in screenwriting and directing television dramas. A notable work is *The Years of Studying with Zhou Enlai*, which won the Second Prize of the Flying Apsaras Awards (Feitian Awards) and the Excellent Short TV Drama Award at the Golden Eagle Awards.

He previously served as Chair of the Theoretical Committee of the China Photographers Association and has frequently been a judge for both national and international photography competitions.

He has authored several influential books, including *Fundamentals of Photographic Aesthetics* and *Introduction to Photographic Appreciation*.

He has published over a million words of articles and hundreds of photographs in newspapers and magazines both domestically and internationally. His academic papers, such as *An Analysis of Chinese Academic-Style Cinema*, have won awards at home and abroad.

In 2006, he was honored by the China Photographers Association as one of the “Outstanding Photographers of the 50th Anniversary of the Founding of New China.”



Emma Zhao

Independent Photographer and Instructor of Practical Mobile Photography Courses, currently based in Toronto, Canada.

Former Vice President of the Atlantic Photographers Association and former Art Mentor of the North American Mobile Photography Association. Her photography works have received multiple awards in both domestic and international photography competitions.

7. ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- All submissions must be original work taken by the participant using a mobile phone, tablet, or iPad.
- Each entry must be titled, and a brief description is encouraged.
- Color and black-and-white works are accepted.
- No watermarks, signatures, or borders are allowed.
- Participants must retain the original files and complete photo information. The organizers reserve the right to request original works for verification.
- No restrictions on the date and time a photo was taken.
- Entries should be in JPEG format.
- The long side of the photo should be no less than 1,024 pixels. The file size should not exceed 5MB.
- No entries will be returned.
- By entering the competition, participants agree to authorize the use of their submitted works for promotion and display by the Awards and the organizing committee.
- Members of the competition organizing committee and judging panel are not eligible to participate.
- AI-generated works are not accepted.
- Commercially purposed portraits, whether already used or intended for future use, are not accepted. If a work includes a personal portrait, participants must be able to prove that they have permission from the subject or model, do not infringe on privacy or portrait rights, and agree to the entry requirements outlined above.
- Works from commercial photography agencies are not accepted.
- Participants under 18 years of age must have submissions made by a parent or adult guardian.



7.1 SUBMISSION DATES

November 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025 (Eastern Time)

7.2 SUBMISSION AND FEES

- Each participant may submit up to six images, including up to three series under Theme 1. Each series counts as one image.
- The first two images: Free submission (no entry fee).
- Images three - six: \$10.00 (USD) per image (participants outside the United States may pay in equivalent currencies).

7.3 SUBMISSION METHODS

7.3.1 Global (all regions except Mainland China)

Submit via the official competition website: <http://www.gwmpa.org> or scan the QR code to enter the website.

7.3.2 Mainland China

- Register and submit through the WeChat mini-program.
- A WeChat QR code will be provided before November 1, 2025.
